





RULES & REGULATIONS

GENERAL RULES

- ENTRIES: Please complete your entries online at www.HorseShowing.com by Monday, Oct. 4, 2021. There is a short users' guide available; be sure to read it. No mail, phone/ fax/or hand-delivered entries will be accepted. (DO NOT enter for USHJA Zone 3 Championship. Letters of invitation will be mailed by the end of September.) For entry questions, contact: Beverly Abbott, bev.Abbott2575@gmail.com
- **ILLNESS:** Should a horse/pony or rider become ill or injured before Oct. 9, 2021, entry fees, if paid in advance, will be refunded, less a \$50 office charge, upon receipt of a veterinarian's or doctor's letter. No refunds will be made after the closing date. Substitution of horse/pony or rider will be allowed.
- TICKETED WARM-UP: Wednesday, Oct. 20, 10:00 a.m. 6:00 p.m. Fee: \$30 per ticket. Tickets may be purchased in the Horse Show office. Back number must be worn in the ring.
- AWARDS: Eight ribbons will be awarded in each class. Division champions will receive a cooler or pillow and championship ribbon.
- **STABLING:** Stabling will be available at \$185 per stall (\$210 if reserved after Oct. 5). Stalls will be available Wednesday, Oct. 20, after 8:00 a.m. and must be vacated by the close of the show on Sunday, Oct. 24.
 - -Permanent stalls of wood construction, 10×10 with doors, are available. Temporary stalls of vinyl construction, 10×10 with doors and under canvas are available after supply of permanent stalls has been exhausted.
- **GROUNDS FEE:** A \$45 grounds fee will be charged to entries not stabled at Moven Park International Equestrian Center. Hunter Breeding entries exempt from grounds fee.
- EQUINE AMBULANCE: A \$7 fee for the equine ambulance will be added to each entry.
- NON-NEGOTIABLE CHECKS may disqualify an entry and the exhibitor will be charged a \$50 collection fee. Exhibitors with outstanding debts to WIHS will not be allowed to compete.
- CLASS SIZE: Management reserves the right to combine sections if there are insufficient entries. In all sections, the number of entries will be limited to a first-come, first-served basis.
- **COURTESY:** Management reserves the right to decline any entry or return any entry fees before or during the show, without being liable for damages. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to any judge or official by an owner, rider, trainer or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit all entry fees.
- **SMOKING** is not permitted on the grounds of Morven Park International Equestrian Center.
- **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** A current negative Coggins test must be presented along with certificates of vaccination. Pursuant to USEF GR-845 all horses must have certificate of vaccination for EIV and EHV within 6 months of the start of the competition.
- VETERINARIAN: During the show, the veterinarian's telephone number will be posted in the show office.
- HORSE OWNERSHIP: The owner listed on the entry blank must be the owner listed on horse's USHJA registration papers or provide proof of ownership or lease.
- OMISSIONS: WIHS is not responsible for errors and/or omissions in the prize list.



REMINDER: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement, to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. USHJA ZONE 3 CHAMPIONSHIP

- Letters of invitation to compete in USHJA Zone 3 Championship will be emailed/mailed the end of September.
 Approximately the top 20 horses in each section, based on total USEF zone points, will be invited. The qualifying
 period includes shows starting on or after December 1, 2020, through shows starting on or before August 31, 2021.
 Exhibitors will be given one week to accept the invitation. If invitations are not accepted, additional horses will be
 invited.
- Horses, ponies and riders participating in the USHJA Zone 3 Championship on Sunday also may compete in the WIHS Regional Horse Show on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

HUNTER CLASSES

- All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted. Manners and suitability of horse/ pony to rider shall be emphasized and extreme speed shall be penalized. Under saddle classes will be shown at a walk, trot and canter in both directions of the ring.
- Champion and reserve champion will be awarded to two of the four entries accumulating the most points over fences in each hunter section. In addition to these points, only these four entries shall receive points for ribbons won in one under saddle class (per USEF Rule HU138).
- All riders competing in adult amateur classes must have a current amateur certification from USEF. This rule applies to all adult amateur riders whether they are members or non-members of USEF.
- All riders competing in pony classes must have a current measurement card or measurement certification issued by USEF or be measured at the show. Please see show office for measurement date.

JUMPER CLASSES

- There is no nominating fee for jumpers. The class entry fee must be paid by the close of entries, October 4, 2021.
 Late entries will be accepted only on a space-available basis. If late entries are accepted, an additional \$25 late fee will be charged.
- All riders competing in adult amateur classes must have a current amateur certification from USEF, whether they are members or non-members of USEF.
- Horses tied for other than first place will be placed based on their first round time unless otherwise indicated.

QUALIFYING FOR WIHS CHAMPIONSHIPS AT TRYON INTERNATIONAL EQUESTRIAN CENTER

- All classes, including qualifying classes for the WIHS Championship at Tryon International Equestrian Center, are
 open to all horses and ponies regardless of geographical location. Owner listed on the entry blank must be the
 owner listed on horse's USEF/USHJA registration papers or provide proof of ownership or lease.
- The overall WIHS Regional Horse Show Children's and Adult Hunter champions may choose to compete in the WIHS Children's or Adult Hunter Championships at Tryon International Equestrian Center.
- The overall WIHS Regional Horse Show Children's and Adult Amateur Jumper champions automatically will qualify for the WIHS Championship at Tryon.

Jumping faults of mount not to count. Fall of horse or rider or three disobediences shall eliminate a contender. There must be at least three (3) exhibitors to fill the class and three (3) exhibitors must complete the course in order for that particular class to count. Six Ribbons. This Medal cannot be combined with any other VHSA Medal or any other Division/Class. In the Finals, same testing applies.

GITTINGS HORSEMANSHIP FINALS

Class 302, Pre-Entry Fee: \$50

MHSA will extend invitations to all Junior Members of the Association who have qualified for this class during the competition year. Letters of invitation will be emailed, please wait for official notification to enter.

To be considered timely, your entry for this class must be made by the closing date of the show. The class shall be judged numerically on the performance of rider over eight or more jumps, with wings, 3' in height, seat and hands; guidance and control of the mount throughout the whole course. The course must contain an oxer and at least one change of direction and three of the following which may not be combined: bending line, narrow jump (6'-8'), roll back turn, fence at the end of the ring, long approach to a single. Jumping faults shall not be counted. Numerical scoring will be used. Riders will be eliminated after two refusals in the MHSA Gittings Horsemanship Finals. No less than 10 riders will return on the flat. All riders must show all gaits (walk, trot, and canter) in both directions; as well as lengthening of stride at all working gaits in each direction. This sitting trot should be at a working sitting trot. The counter canter in both directions is required. In addition, the judge must require a minimum of 4 riders to perform additional tests (USEF tests 1-17 – Refer to EQ112).

MHSA CHILDREN'S PONY MEDAL

Class 301, Fee: \$35 (one fee for both MHSA and VHSA Children's Pony Medal)

Open to Junior riders on ponies. Riders may not compete in MHSA Hunter Seat on Ponies Medal at the same show. Tojump 8 fences of hunter type with or without wings. The course must contain an oxer, at least one change of direction, and two of the following which may not be combined: a bending line, a narrow jump (6'-8'), a roll back turn, a fence at the end of the ring, or a long approach to a single fence. No in and out can be used. Small/medium ponies to jump 2', and large ponies to jump 2'6". Exhibitors who lose their junior status as of December 1st shall not be eligible to compete in MHSA Children's Pony Medal classes held after the finals competition during that year. Class to be judged on hands, seat, guidance and control throughout. To fill a class, 4 must complete the course. Only one rider per pony. The MHSA Children's Pony Medal class may be run concurrently with the MHSA Children' Pony Hunter division and the VHSA Children's Pony Medal class. To qualify for MHSA Children's Pony Medal Finals, rider must be a member of MHSA. Those competing atthe Finals need to be a USEF/USHJA member or pay a USEF/USHJA non-member fee. Rider's pony for the finals must have a USEF Pony Measurement Card.

MHSA ADULT AMATEUR MEDAL

Class 306, Fee: \$35

Open to horses and ponies ridden by amateur exhibitor who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year, and who are MHSA Senior Amateur Members. Members competing in classes restricted to amateurs must meet the requirements of USEF rule GR1306. Your signature as rider on the entry blank and annual membership form will verify that you understand and are in compliance with the rule. If split by age, it shall be split 18 -35 and 36 and older. May be combined with Junior Equitation if there are fewer than 4 entries. 18-35 and 36 and older. To bejudged equally on hands, seat, control and suitability of mount. The fence heights for the over fences class shall be 2'6" and 3'. The flat class is to be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. Additional tests may be required. May be combined with Junior Equitation if there are fewer than 4 entries.

\$1,000 MHSA INVITATIONAL THOROUGHBRED HUNTER 3'0" CLASSIC

Class 650, Pre-Entry Fee: \$50, Post-Entry Fee: \$100

MHSA will extend invitations to the top 25 Thoroughbreds who have qualified for this class during the competition year. The class is limited to horses who are registered with or are eligible to be registered with The Jockey Club. Letters of invitation will be emailed; please wait for official notification to enter. To be considered timely, your entry for this class must be made by the closing date of the show. Prize money will be awarded in the Classic and sent to exhibitors by MHSA.


The class will be judged on performance and soundness using the numerical scoring system. This is a two-round classic with the first round and second round scores being added together for an overall score. Two refusals will result in elimination.

Starting Order: Based on points earned with the lowest points going first and the competitor with the most points going last.

FIRST ROUND: In the first round, each competitor will compete over a hunter course of at least ten obstacles at 3'0" which may include an in and out.

SECOND ROUND: The top ten competitors with the highest scores will return over a shortened course of at least eight obstacles at 3'0". The order of return will be based off of the first-round scores, with the lowest score going first.

To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count. Horses and Ponies are not required to jog for soundness.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:

To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:

Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under - to be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 15th birthday by December 1, of the current competition year. Children's Hunter Horse 15-17 - to be ridden by exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday by December 1, of the current competition year. Children's Pony - Small/Medium - to be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 15th birthday by December 1, of the current competition year. Children's Pony - Large - to be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1, of the current competition year.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Sections offered and requirements: Adult Amateurs – may be split into three (3) sections. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4. GR108

MOTORIZED VEHICLE RULE

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Every class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.
